Epidemic level drug problem


- More deaths in SF from overdose than COVID-19 in 2020
- Estimated 10.1 million people/year misuse opioids alone
- More than 70,000 people/year die of drug overdose
 - In recent years, more than 70% from opioids





It's right here...in San Bruno

- Enough Fentanyl to kill entire SB population 3 times
- Hundreds of emergency Naloxone administrations
- Encountering Fentanyl/other opioids daily
- And...methamphetamine use is surging as well







Emergent, new, poorly understood

- Doesn't look, smell, or act like anything else
- Far more dangerous than anything we've seen
- Multiple methods of use
- Signs of use not initially obvious
- Anxiety relief makes it very attractive/addictive





Elimination of D.A.R.E. left a void

- Early, research-based drug education
 - Appearance, use, effects, dangers, symptoms, etc.
- Knowledgeable resource for kids' questions
- United kids in commitment to living drug free





D.A.R.E. shortcomings

- No parental education component
- No teachers/staff education component
- Failed to keep up with trends and be relevant
- Fear-based approach



SBPD wants to help



- Fill the void left by the end of D.A.R.E.
- Leverage what worked
- Improve what did not work
- From fear-based to education/reality based





Reducing the Impact of Drugs on Families "Let's get RID OF this epidemic"

Key Components of the Program



- Age group
 - Young enough to be influenced/open
 - Old enough to understand
- Relevant, accurate, contemporary information
- Less fear-based
 - More believable, real-world repercussions
- Relationship/trust building
 - Group and individual interactions
- Parental education
 - With and without kids
- Teacher/staff education
- Feedback, evaluation, adjustment, growth



Stage One (Current)

- Staff member training
- Curriculum development
- Drug/paraphernalia displays







Stage Two (June)

- Finalize curriculum
- Dry runs
- Scheduling with schools



Stage Three (September)

- Program promotion
- Begin conducting program for first half of schools







Stage Four (December)

- Program promotion
- Begin conducting program for second half of schools
- Feedback
- Grant reporting
