SUBJECT: Receive Written Update on the City's Response Efforts to COVID-19

BACKGROUND: This report is to provide an update on the City's response efforts to COVID-19, while the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is activated. The information provided in this report is as of the time it was produced and may be subject to change.

DISCUSSION: San Mateo County Health provides regular COVID-19 data dashboards through their website, smchealth.org. San Mateo County Health reports as of July 1, 2022, there were a total of 188 cases within the last 30 days in the City of San Bruno; and as of July 4, 2022, approximately 97.9% of San Bruno residents age 5+ are vaccinated. Additional statistics are attached to this report.

The San Bruno Emergency Operations Center (EOC) continues to review City services and modifications, and there are no operational modifications to report to the City Council.

COVID-19 Testing

The City of San Bruno has partnered with Curative to offer no out-of-pocket cost COVID-19 testing to the community. The partnership was recently extended, and testing will remain open and available to the public. To book an appointment, visit cur.tv/sanbruno or call 888-702-9042. Appointments are preferred to minimize wait times, however they are not required. Walk-up / on-site registration is also available at the testing site, which is located at Narita Plaza, between San Bruno City Hall (570 Linden Avenue, San Bruno) and the San Bruno Library. The testing site is open Monday through Friday, 8:30AM-4:00PM.

COVID-19 Vaccine

Parents and caregivers of young children now eligible for COVID-19 vaccines should contact their pediatric provider to schedule an appointment. County Health's community clinics continue to offer vaccines and boosters to residents 5 and older. To find a community clinic or local pharmacy visit myturn.ca.gov or call 1-833-422-4255.

California Mortgage Relief Program

Homeowners who have fallen behind on mortgage payments may qualify for a new state program. The California Mortgage Relief Program offers assistance for past due housing payments up to \$80,000 per household. To qualify, one must own (and occupy) a home, meet income requirements, be behind at least two payments and have been financially impacted by

FISCAL IMPACT: Since the declaration of emergency in March of 2020, the City of San Bruno has recorded the emergency expenditure of \$200,120 out of the City's emergency reserve funds for COVID related operations. In total, the City has recorded a total COVID related expenditure of \$2.08 million including facilities enhancement projects (i.e. keyless entry system to City Hall), COVID-19 personal protective equipment (PPE) supplies, and initial response and adaptation to remote programming/services.

There are no additional expenditures to report for the specific period of this report.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT: There is no environmental impact. The action is not a project subject to CEQA. City Council's action is not considered a "Project" per CEQA Guidelines and therefore no further environmental analysis is required.

RECOMMENDATION: Receive Written Update on the City's Response Efforts to COVID-19

ALTERNATIVES: The City of San Bruno's Emergency Operations Center remains activated and there are no alternatives proposed at this time.
