**SUBJECT**: Receive Written Update on the City's Response Efforts to COVID-19

**BACKGROUND**: This report is to provide an update on the City's response efforts to COVID-19, while the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is activated. The information provided in this report is as of the time it was produced and may be subject to change.

**DISCUSSION**: San Mateo County Health provides regular COVID-19 data dashboards through their website, <u>smchealth.org</u>. San Mateo County Health reports as of Dec. 29, 2022, there are a total of 480 cases within the last 30 days in the City of San Bruno and as of Dec. 28, 2022, approximately >95% of San Bruno residents are vaccinated. Additional statistics are attached to this report.

There are no City services or operational modifications to report to the City Council.

FISCAL IMPACT: There are no new fiscal impacts to report to the City Council.

Since the declaration of emergency in March of 2020, the City of San Bruno has recorded the emergency expenditure of \$200,120 out of the City's emergency reserve funds for COVID related operations. In total, the City has recorded a total COVID related expenditure of \$2.08 million including facilities enhancement projects (i.e. keyless entry system to City Hall), COVID-19 personal protective equipment (PPE) supplies, and initial response and adaptation to remote programming/services.

In total, the City has received Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursements totaling \$31,067. There are approximately \$96,316 pending receipt of funds, and another \$13,884 in invoices under review by FEMA.

**ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**: There is no environmental impact. The action is not a project subject to CEQA. City Council's action is not considered a "Project" per CEQA Guidelines and therefore no further environmental analysis is required.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Receive Written Update on the City's Response Efforts to COVID-19.

**ALTERNATIVES:** The City of San Bruno's Emergency Operations Center remains activated and there are no alternatives proposed at this time.
